15.3 –Terminations or Suspensions of membership

Note by the Secretariat

1. BACKGROUND

Since the last Council session and after the Secretariat had exhausted all efforts to have the outstanding contributions settled with no success, the following organizations are in position to be removed from IALA membership or have their rights suspended.

2. TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

- **M/S Navaid Energy Private Ltd, India.** This organization has been an Industrial member since 2017. They owe three years of contributions.
- **IRM Offshore and Marine Engineers Pvt. Ltd, India.** This organization has been an Industrial member since 2017. They owe 3 years of contributions.
- **Kosolar Co., Ltd, Rep of Korea.** This organization has been an Industrial member since 1999. They owe 4 Years of contributions.
- **Dongjoo Engineering Co., Ltd, Rep of Korea.** This organization has been an Industrial member since 2014. They owe 3 Years of contributions.
- **ITO S.r.l, Italy.** This organization has been a member since 2006. They owe 4 years of contributions.

3. UPDATE ON SUSPENDED MEMBERSHIP

- **Office National de Signalisation Maritime, Algeria** This organization is a member since 1963 and was suspended at Council 69. As a reply to a reminder letter sent by the Secretary-General on 17 November, they inform IALA that payment of contributions to International non-governmental organizations is a very long process for public bodies in the country but that all the steps were taken to settle this due. They recognize the importance of the work of IALA and beg the Council not to terminate their membership.
- **Direction Générale de la Marine Marchande, Rep of Congo.** This Organization is a member since 2015 and was suspended at Council 69. However, their Minister who was invited by the Council in December 2014 when they join was recently invited to address on the occasion of a webinar organized by the World-Wide Academy for the African French speaking countries. On this occasion, he renewed his recognition to IALA for its actions and achievements worldwide and assured by return of their willingness to fully fill up their obligations in the future. A reminder letter was recently sent by the Secretary-General of which they acknowledged receipt.
- **Nigerian Ports Authority, Nigeria.** This organization has been a member since 2011 and was suspended by Council 69. IALA was informed of a new management early this year and that

they would pay a careful attention to this matter. A reply to the reminder letter sent by the Secretary General on 17 November is still awaited.

The status of these three members will be reviewed at the next Council session 73.
